EASTER TRADITIONS

Easter Lilies – Symbolizes purity and hope, rebirth and the resurrection of Jesus Christ. White represents innocence, and the trumpet shaped bloom signifies the announcement of new life.

Easter Eggs – Symbolizes the resurrection of Jesus Christ, representing the empty tomb (egg shell) and new life (baby chick) . In some traditions, the 3 parts of the egg (shell, white, yolk) represent the Holy Trinity.

Hot Cross Buns – Traditionally eaten on Good Friday. Sweet rolls with a cross representing the crucifixion and spices such as cinnamon and nutmeg representing those used in Jesus' burial.

Sunrise Services – Honors the tradition that Mary Magdalene discovered the empty tomb early in the morning.

Easter Bonnets and New Outfits - A tradition representing the renewal of life and putting on a "new life" in Christ.
